


What is the Solihull Approach?

The Solihull Approach model is a helpful framework for thinking about relationships, behaviour and emotional health and well-being. Supports work with families, children and young people. Individual, group and online. Antenatal to 18 years.

Reciprocity – describes the sophisticated interaction between a baby and an adult where both the baby and the adult are involved in the initiation, regulation and termination of the interaction. Reciprocity also applies to the interaction between adults.



Containment is where a person receives and understanding the emotional communication of another without being overwhelmed by it and communicates this back to the other person. This process can restore the capacity to think.

Behaviour Management – sensitive and effective behaviour management is a product of containment and reciprocity and therefore is placed at the end of the process and is customised to the parent/child relationship

Solihull Approach Training

2 Day Foundation training

- Core/ multiagency 0-18 years

- Keeping Trauma in Mind practitioners working with adults

Whole school training Inset day plus twilight follow-ups

Group Facilitator trainings

Solihull Approach Groups

Group for parents

'Understanding your child's behaviour' 10-week group for all parents

Antenatal Parenting Group

'Understanding pregnancy, labour, birth and your baby'

(5 week course) merging information about labour and birth with focus on developing parent-baby relationship

Postnatal *Group 'Understanding your baby'* 6-8 week course for parents of 0-12 month olds, focus on relationship and emotional development

Foster Carers' Course

(12 week group) Focus on understanding what is being communicated through a child's behaviour
