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The Solihull Approach in New York

Since last summer, the Parent Center at Henry Street Settlement has graduated dozens of parents from 9 Solihull Approach Parenting groups, open to parents throughout the New York City area.

Graduates of the parenting groups express their appreciation for the support, insight and information that they have gotten from their participation in the groups. One father noticed that since his participation in the class his children "listen better - I explain more about why and it helps them express themselves better - less frustration. (It is) reassuring to know there are others going through the same things". Another mother noticed that her daughter

is "more willing to compromise because I learned to listen better and the communication improved greatly".

Henry Street Settlement was founded in 1893 to provide assistance to residents of the lower east side, a center of immigrant population in New York City. Over a hundred years later, Henry Street continues to provide a broad array of services to the lower east side which remains home to a diverse group of residents, many of whom are newly arrived immigrants. From daycare to care for seniors, afterschool activities to job training, Henry Street helps strengthens and empower individuals and families. Becky Plattus, NY

Solihull Approach in Pakistan

What an exciting moment! After two years I am sitting watching 38 women in a small room with no air conditioning and no power at all for an hour. The temperature is 40 degrees and I am watching as I cannot understand most of what is being said. I am in Islamabad attending the celebration of the women who have completed the 10 week Solihull Approach 'Understanding Your Child's Behaviour' course.

The course has been run in 3 venues and has been a resounding success to the surprise of the facilitators

who, prior to running the course, insisted it was too long and they would definitely have a 50% drop out. The actual result was quite different. An 89% retention rate! 42 women completed the course and they have a waiting list for the courses they are planning to run in September 2013.

These Urdu speaking ladies come from a variety of backgrounds and gave such positive feedback today I know the course has made a difference to so many of these women.

NEW RESEARCH 2013:

A service evaluation of the Solihull Approach training and practice

Moore, T., Adams, M. and Pratt, R. (2013) Community Practitioner, Vol 86(5): 26-27. Previous service evaluations have concentrated on the effectiveness of the training with health visitors. This study, from Norfolk, looked at the effectiveness with other practitioners and compared the scores of health visitors and family support workers on an 18 item questionnaire. The study found similar results in both groups. The questionnaire used is very interesting and may be helpful to other researchers.
