New research on the Solihull Approach parenting programme


The Solihull Approach parenting programme 'Understanding your child's behaviour' reduces behavioural difficulties in children whilst also reducing anxiety in parents. We wanted an insight into why parenting skills improved.

137 parents completed feedback questionnaires on their experience of each of the 10 sessions of the group. We asked them how relaxed they felt and how able they felt to share experiences, how much the group enabled them to understand their child and how much the group enabled them to change.

98% of people felt that

the group helped them to relax and share experiences. The unexpected results happened with the next two questions.


Jane Barlow, University of Warwick, systematically reviewed parenting programmes for NICE and found that effective parenting programmes tended to consist of 10 sessions of 2 hours each. But why? This graph shows that parents understanding of



their child increased over

the 10 sessions (red line).

change (red line).

Interesting! Understanding comes before change. And both increase over 10 sessions

This fits with social learning theory, that we learn from others in different ways, so its perhaps not surprising that it takes a bit of time for us to change our parenting. 10 sessions for most people!

Antenatal Solihull Approach

We are continuing to develop resources for antenatal and postnatal work.

The 2 day Foundation training for antenatal practitioners is being delivered to children's centres and to teams of midwives. The training is supported by the antenatal resource pack 'The journey to parenthood'. The Peer Breast Feeding Supporters training pack is available to help train parents in children's centres.

The Solihull Approach Antenatal parentcraft programme is being extensively piloted and evaluated and will be ready soon. It consists of five sessions of 2 hours each and is

already popular with both mothers and fathers here in Solihull. Children's centres are delivering it, although it has also been run in hospitals.

We are aware that midwife availability is an issue in some areas, so although having a midwife in all of the sessions is preferable, we have designed it so that only two of the

five sessions require a midwife.

We are also nearing completion on a 'Welcome to nursery' training re-

source which our original Sure Start initiated and which has been very successful in preparing parents and their children for nursery.

The North West Region in England have published a commissioning document for providers of perinatal and infant mental health services.

Developments include 1/2 day modules

We are working towards developing the 'Preparing for toddlerhood' and the 'Brain development' trainings as 1/2 day modules that you can then deliver in your local area to practitioners as a CPD (continuous professional development) event.

We will then be turning the



'Preparing for toddlerhood' into a workshop for parents that any Solihull Approach practitioner can deliver.

The Whole School training manual is nearly complete for

the 'Understanding your pupil's behaviour'. This can be delivered by any Solihull Approach trainer.

The 2 day Foundation training for workers in fostering and adoption is available. The accompanying 12 week Solihull Approach course for foster carers is currently being evaluated, but the best accolade is that foster carers from the course are saying that it should run for all foster carers
