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Session 5	Section Reciprocity in more depth		<p>Rupture and Repair No-one is perfectly in tune with another person. The concept of rupture and repair is very important. There are always ruptures in the Dance. The most important part of 'rupture and repair' is the repair. The experience of repair within a relationship may form the basis for hope and optimism in a person: that things can get better. As you can imagine, it is crucial in order for human beings to get on with each other! Rupture and repair can be seen in this vignette of the interaction between Joey and his mother. You could re-read the last part of the quote from 'Her face and voice are even more full of delight'. Joey's mother is clearly enjoying herself and hasn't noticed that it is all getting a bit much for Joey. Joey takes himself out of the interaction. His mother notices, waits and brings him back. There is a rupture and there is a repair.</p>
