

What you need to do to cascade Solihull Approach Parenting Group Facilitators' training in your local area

You need to:

- Have attended Solihull Approach two-day foundation training
- Used Solihull Approach in your practice applying theory to practice
- Have attended the Solihull Approach Parenting Group Facilitators' one-day training
- One of the facilitators should have run a group
- Attended a one-day Train the Trainers – Parenting. On this training you will receive a Solihull Approach Training Manual outlining how you should deliver the cascade training
- Run the cascade training as specified in the Solihull Approach Training Manual
- Each training group should not have more than 12 delegates.

When you are cascading the Solihull Approach Parenting Group Facilitators' training in local area you need to ensure that:

- Each delegate who attends your training has:
 - Completed the Solihull Approach foundation training (two days) delivered either by Solihull Approach team or professionals from local area who have cascaded the Solihull Approach training
 - At least 1-6 months experience of working with the Solihull Approach.

Prior to commencing each training you must:

- Contact the Solihull Approach office and provide the Solihull Approach administrator with:
 - The names of delegates attending your training
 - The dates these delegates attended the two-day Solihull Approach foundation training.
- Purchase an individual Solihull Approach Parenting Group Facilitators' Manual (purchased from the Solihull Approach office) for each delegate.

You will not be able to purchase packs without providing the Solihull Approach administrator with the names of delegates receiving training and the dates they attended the Solihull Approach two-day foundation training.

You will need to make local arrangements for delegates you plan to train to have access to local supervision when running a Solihull Approach Parenting Group.
